

This Little Light of Mine...



On August 21st of this past month, a very unique natural occurrence happened to us in this area of the United States—a total solar eclipse (in parts a little west of Asheville), or an almost total solar eclipse (99.1%) in Asheville proper. My family took the opportunity since it was so close to go to Dillsboro and witness totality. I'm glad we did, though the traffic on the way home was a bit horrendous. However, it is the first time that this area has seen a total solar eclipse since the year 1506! If you were in the path of totality when the event happened, you had around two and a half minutes of the moon totally covering the sun's rays, you were able

to see the stars in the middle of the day, there were some really cool shadows everywhere, and there was a ripple-like shadow that seemed to float over the surface of the concrete during that brief time that the sun was covered.

If you were not in the path of totality, then I'm told that it didn't get quite dark enough for the stars to appear in the sky and that it didn't get nearly as dark as it did in the path of totality. It is amazing what a difference just a fraction of one percent makes when it comes to the effects of a solar eclipse. This has led me to think about other things in life as well. In virtually every other part of life, 99.1% is considered to be pretty near perfect and not something to worry about. If a student makes a 99 on a test, then it is still an A. If something costs 99 cents then it is basically considered to cost \$1. In almost every other event in life, 99% is good enough—but not when it comes to the experience of witnessing the effects of a solar eclipse.

Jesus understood that 99% is not 100%, and he called for his followers to give not just 99% of themselves to his service, but all—100 percent—and nothing less. Many Christians are much more content to offer something more along the lines of 5% of our lives in service of God. Some very committed Christians might even go so far as to offer 50% or 75%, but hardly anyone gives 100 % to Christ. The metaphor of Christians being "light" in the darkness is a very prevalent one in Scripture. "No one lights a lamp and puts it under a bushel basket, but on a stand where it can give light to all." One of the first songs that children in the church learn is the classic "This Little Light of Mine." Ironically, when we fail to give 100% to the service of God, we wind up blocking the light of the world revealed in Christ. There are times when the light seems to be completely blocked, and there are times when the light shines so bright it hurts our eyes; but through it all we are called to reflect that light and not to block it out.



The rough grading for the parking lot is complete. The doorway by the choir room where the handicapped ramp was located is currently not accessible during construction as we "prepare the way" for a new covered porch, widened door, and level entryway where that door is currently located.
