

Pastor's Note

Over the course of the past few weeks at our church, I've stumbled across a lot of information about trees. The two large white oaks that recently had to be cut down (that were both about 300 years old) simply fascinated me. It was almost unimaginable to think that those trees were almost 100 years old when the Civil War took place!



However, on a scientific basis, I grew to understand a lot about trees and the way they grow. For instance, did you know that almost 90% of what makes up a tree is already dead? The inner layer of wood (that the tree uses mostly for support) is known as "heartwood." The outer inch or so, known as the "sapwood" or "cambium" layer, is the only part of the tree that is actually living and transporting nutrients and water from the ground to the branches and leaves of the tree.


Basically, this means that those historic white oaks on

our grounds were made up of a very thin layer of living material that is responsible for most of the modern growth of the tree.

Pastor's Note (continued)


"Why on earth am I writing about the scientific nature of trees," you may ask? It is because there is a deep theological lesson in the science of those trees for our church today, apart from any scientific explanation. Namely, the outermost layer is the only "living" part of a tree. The rest of the tree, no matter how historic and old it may be, is already dead. When surveying the annual rings of trees, one can instantly observe how fertile a particular point in history was by analyzing how thick the growth rings were for a particular time. The annual rings of the trees recently removed revealed some startling revelations. There was a point in time (about a decade after The Civil War) when the tree grew more in three years than in the previous 50 years of growth! Though slow growth provides for a more stable and historically grounded organism, rapid growth greatly increases the size of the tree in ways that people can experience here and now. Our church is currently in a time when the growth rings have been tight and close together. The spaces between those rings have seen a steady tightening in recent years. This makes for a more stable tree, but it also means that growth has been almost halted (or worse).

A tree is dependent upon rainfall and nutrients for growth—and so is our church! Just as trees need water and nutrients to survive, our church needs your prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness to grow. How large the growth we experience is up to you and me! But likewise, a tree is only a few rings away from harvest and death. Had those two White Oaks been Red Oaks instead, they would have only survived for about 100-150 years. So I ask you, what kind of tree do you want our church to be: one that is still growing, or one where the sawmill is already at the base? Do you want our church to be milled into lumber where the dead layers can be utilized for some good even in the midst of misfortune, or do you want our church to continue to grow and to make wonderful strides toward a green and sustainable future?

Thankfully, the largest tree on the corner of our property (estimated at over 500 years old), is still standing and providing historical precedent and current shelter and sustenance to our community. I was simply astounded when four of us couldn't split some of the chunks of those trees into firewood—even with a ten pound maul being swung by strong, young men! Our church, like those fallen trees, is resilient to the blows of culture, time, and circumstance. But we are not immune. Our annual growth is a direct reflection of our faithfulness. I am not alone in calling for your involvement and contributions to our past, present, and future here at Asbury Memorial.

News from the Missions Committee

The Bread Tin Collections for June will go to support the Grace Children's Hospital and Pediatric Clinic in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Founded by Jim and Virginia Snavely after visiting Haiti and seeing children dying in the streets, Grace Hospital serves the most vulnerable population in the poorest country in the western hemisphere. Their patients are children and their families with tuberculosis, HIV/AIDS, and respiratory infections. None are turned away for inability to pay. The 2010 earthquake demolished most of the hospital; nevertheless it continues providing medical care as well as food and water to victims. Grace Hospital is a Global Ministry of the United Methodist Committee on Relief. Please give generously.

Thank you for your continued support of The Bread Tin Collections. In April 2013, a total of \$229.77 was collected for MARRS. In May 2013, \$334.27 was collected for the Salvation Army of Asheville.
