I invite you to take the words of this devotional to heart, especially as we begin the process of choosing new officers for the church in 2015:

Some people have a job in the church. Others invite themselves into a ministry. What's the difference you ask?

If you are doing it just because no one else will, it's a job.

If you are doing it to serve the Lord, it's a ministry.

If you quit because someone criticized you, it's a job.

If you keep on serving, it's a ministry.

If you'll do it as long as it does not interfere with your other activities, it's a job.

If you are committed to staying even if it means letting go of other things, it's a ministry.

If you quit because no one thanked you or praised you, it's a job. If you stick with it even though no one recognized your efforts, it's a ministry.

It's hard to get excited about a job. It's almost impossible not to get excited about a ministry.

If your concern is success, it's a job.

If your concern is faithfulness and service, it's a ministry.


If God calls you to a ministry, don't treat it like a job!

News from the Missions Committee

The September Bread Tin collection is designated for Nothing But Nets, an international nonprofit organization dedicated to fighting malaria, a leading cause of death among children in Africa. Donations are used to provide insecticide-treated bed nets and educating communities on their use. Though malaria was eliminated in the United States in 1951, it is still deadly elsewhere. A child dies every minute from malaria. Protecting children from the mosquitoes that carry it is the best way to keep them alive. Thank you in advance for giving generously.

By August 28th, some 937 pounds of tuna have been delivered from Asbury to MANNA for 2014. MANNA's newly released hunger study shows that 107,600 people in our 16 WNC counties turn to MANNA food agencies for help. That's up a bit from 4 years ago. About 56% of the households have at least one employed person and yet, they face hunger. Poor health keeps coming up as a reason for hunger....or as a result of hunger...with 63% of households reporting that they have to choose between buying food and paying for medical care and prescriptions. A big change in the study this year is data on grandparents raising grandchildren. Fully 1 in 10 households include a grandparent as primary caregiver for a grandchild. Imagine that--- and imagine a home where food insecurity prevails. We can make a difference with our donations. Put tuna on the shopping list, please.

News from the Choir Director

The Chancel Choir and the Handbell Choir have both begun to work on Christmas! We are preparing a cantata that includes both choirs, and this will be a step up from preparing things independently of each other. Five songs in the selected cantata, Festival of Carols, by Joseph Martin, are beautifully complimented by handbell additions, and the combined workings will present to the Asbury congregation a Christmas offering that will be remembered.

Handbell rehearsal is on Wednesdays at 6pm. Chancel Choir rehearsal follows at 7pm. If you would like to be a participant in either choir, please let me know, or just show up. We have a spot for you, no matter which you would want to concentrate on.

We will present this to the congregation on December 21, at the 11am worship service. Please mark your calendars accordingly, and give some thought to joining a choir during this blessed season.
