A MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT PASTOR

I know you should never wish your life away, but I wish Christmas Eve were here. I love that special night as we hear those wonderful words from the second chapter of Luke. "While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn." It is so easy to just focus on the verses from Luke 2: 1-20 and forget about Mary's Song found in chapter one. Let me share a few verses. Mary had gone to visit her cousin Elizabeth and she bursts out in song about her visit from the Angel Gabriel. "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me…holy is his name." Luke 2: 46-49.

The rest of Mary's Song speaks of the many blessings that God has bestowed upon his people.
