


Message from the Pastor



We will begin a new sermon series beginning on May 31st and running through the end of June at Asbury Memorial UMC on "Sabbath Living." There is a wonderful book that Dr. Matthew Sleeth (a medical doctor) has written entitled 24/6 that is the inspiration for this series. In it, Dr. Sleeth argues that modern folks have lost something critical in our lives and that what we have lost is the essential desire to take time off and to cease working for one day each week as we are beckoned to do in the pages of the Old and New Testaments.

Abraham Lincoln (in the quote from his executive order dated Nov. 15, 1862) stated that no Union soldier should work, fight, or march on Sunday unless under direct attack. His rationale was that if we lost the Sabbath, it did not matter who won the war; we would all become slaves. I find it amazing to think that Lincoln spoke these words way back in the nineteenth century before the time of all the technological innovations of our day and age.

We need to start re-imagining the Sabbath not as a responsibility or a rule that we *have to* follow, but as an opportunity that we *get to* participate in! C.S. Lewis in his famous book *The Screwtape Letters* reminds us that Satan wants to keep noise in our lives so we are unable to hear the quiet voice of God. Remember that the Devil's tool is trickery. He gives us ninety percent truth and ten percent lie. Being industrious is good. Thinking that

A MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT PASTOR

I recently came across a story about a woman who was leaving church one Sunday morning and encountered a young man staring at the church steeple. Thinking perhaps he was lost she stopped to speak to him. His question came as quite a surprise. "Tell me, what is it that you believe in there?" She started to answer him and then realized that she did not know the answer, or at least did not know how to put it in words. As she stumbled to think of an answer, he said, "Never mind. I'm sorry if I bothered you". And he just walked away.

Most of us have been going to church all of our lives, and yet have we ever asked ourselves: Why do I go to church and what is it that I believe? Like the lady in the above story, what if someone were to stop you one Sunday morning and ask, "What you believe in at Asbury Memorial?" Would you be able to give them an answer? It's really a very complicated question to answer if you don't have a resource readily available.

There is an excellent resource in the rack on the pew in front of you. It is United Methodist Hymnal. If you turn to page 880 you will find the Nicene Creed, and on page 881 is the Apostles Creed. Both of these state what we believe about the character of God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit. Now don't forget the best resource ever to speak to what we believe and that is the Holy Bible. You will also find it on the rack in front of you. I encourage you to sit and read from both of these two books. You never know who may just ask you that question: "What is it that you believe in there?"

News from the Missions Committee

Peace With Justice Sunday is Sunday, May 31st. This is a special offering taken across the country to benefit peace with justice initiatives and ministries in our conference and throughout the world through the Board of Church and Society. These programs empower United Methodists to speak out for removing structures and systems that harm God's children globally.

Nine years ago, Luma Mufleh, a native of Jordan, living in Clarkston, Georgia was on her way home from work and she noticed a group of boys playing soccer. They piqued her interest and she discovered that they were all refugees of war. Through organized soccer, she was able to draw them together. Upon doing this, she realized that they did not know English and were lacking in fundamental academic skills. So began the Fugees Academy, seven years ago, originally for boys grades 6-12. Currently the school serves both boys and girls ages 10-18 with a year-round soccer program, afterschool tutoring, soccer for 50 elementary-aged children, an academic summer camp, and the Fugees Academy, a fully-accredited school dedicated specifically to children who are refugees of war

Our church has supported this organization in the past and the Missions Committee is pleased to recommend them for the June Bread Tin offering. This offering has helped children from 26 countries who otherwise would struggle academically and socially if it were not for the vision of one woman from Jordan who found a way to help children succeed. Thank you for giving generously!

Thanks to everyone who donated items for the foster children to attend Camp Tekoa. It looks as if our contributions and those of others around the Conference will outfit all of the children. Many thanks!

Please continue to add beef stew to your grocery list. We are well on our way to collecting 2015 pounds of beef stew and any other meal-in-a-can for MANNA FoodBank. Thank you for your support!
