An Open Letter From the Bishop and the Cabinet To the people of the Western North Carolina Conference



From the Bishop and Cabinet

Like many others we, the Bishop and the Superintendents of the Western North Carolina Conference, recognize the crossroads at which we stand in The United Methodist Church. Many across our Conference are deeply concerned and have expressed frustration and regret about the meetings and decisions of some Annual Conferences and Jurisdictional Conferences over the past two months not to follow provisions of the Book of Discipline regarding marriage and

ordination standards which they believe are discriminatory. Most recently in the Western Jurisdiction, the election to the office of bishop of Rev. Karen Oliveto who has been described as "an openly lesbian clergyperson," has ignited concerns for our denomination as well as questions about our polity and our unity. Others across our area, however, believe these actions are signs of a new day and a different future for The United Methodist Church.

Concurring with the pastoral letter from the College of Bishops of the Southeastern Jurisdiction, we "view the acts of nonconformity as a violation of our covenant..." We remain hopeful that the collaborative efforts of the commission that was approved at General Conference will provide a way forward. While that work continues, we are committed to maintaining our covenant to uphold The Book of Discipline.

Open Letter from the Bishop-continued from p.1

How shall we move forward in the light of these actions in other parts of our connection? First, we urge the clergy and laity across the conference to be patient. Bishop Bruce Ough, President of the Council of Bishops, wrote: "Our Book of Discipline has clearly delineated processes in place for resolving issues even as complex and unprecedented as this election (of Rev. Oliveto)." Those processes take time and require us to be patient as they work their way through the system.

Second, we urge everyone to join us in fervent prayer for our church and for our witness in the world in the name of Jesus. We believe that there is no substitute for the on-going prayers of God's people, humbly asking and seeking God's Spirit to intervene and reveal a way forward. To that end, we have committed to a weekly time of fasting for the sake of the unity of our church. As has been true in every age and for every situation which the church has confronted since the Day of Pentecost, we must be open and responsive to the leading of God's Spirit and not our own. As the Apostle Paul wrote to the church in Rome: "rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer" (Romans 12:12).

Finally, we urge all of our churches to stay the course and to remain focused on the mission. We rejoice in the many ways that God is working through the churches of the Western North Carolina Conference and the manner in which you are all remaining committed to the mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of lives, communities, and the world. We will continue to lead and to live faithfully into the covenant we have made with God through our baptism, with The United Methodist Church through our ordination, and with each other through our faith in Christ Jesus.

In response to the invitation from Bishop Ough to all United Methodists, we will daily offer our fervent prayers for the witness of The United Methodist Church, "making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:3). We earnestly invite all of you to join us in these offerings of prayer, fasting, and sacrifice.

Message from the Assistant Pastor

"To allow oneself to be carried away by a multitude of conflicting concerns, to surrender to too many demands, to commit to too many projects, to want to help everyone in everything is itself to succumb to the violence of our times. Frenzy destroys our inner capacity for peace. It destroys the fruitfulness of our work, because it kills the root of inner wisdom which makes work fruitful." Thomas Merton

The Missions Committee announces that the bread tin for August supports **Wells for Sustainability in South Sudan:**

The United Methodist Committee on Relief explains the importance of wells and clean water in this troubled country: "Access to clean water is a fundamental need, yet as many as 60% of households in South Sudan do not have access to clean drinking water. Unsafe water leads to diarrhea, dysentery, typhoid, cholera, and other diseases that strike children with particular virulence. In South Sudan, one in four children will die before their fifth birthday and more than 98% of children drop out of elementary school, often because they are too sick to attend. While improved health is the primary benefit of the well, the community benefits in other ways. When women and children must walk for long distances to obtain clean water, they are exposed to physical hardships and danger. They spend so much time obtaining water and carrying heavy containers that they have little time and energy for other activities such as attending school, caring for their families, and farming to produce food."

It is hard for us to imagine what life is like without reliable clean water available at all times. Let's give generously to help make this necessity of life available to others.

The June Bread Tin collected \$768.14 for The Potter's Touch, a network of Spiritual Directors of the UMC who encourage and support clergy and laity in the intentional tending of their spiritual lives. Thank you for giving generously.

Please continue to bring contributions of food for the babies of MANNA Foodbank, or money to be converted to contributions, so we can meet our target of 2016 pounds of food for Western North Carolina babies. Thank you as always for giving generously!



The Capital Campaign Committee met in mid-July to assess pledge and donation responses. As of July 31, 2016, the total funds on hand are \$86,666.64. For the information of all members and anyone owning a conventional IRA, anyone over 70.5 is required to take a minimum required distribution (MRD) each year or pay a penalty of 50% of the distribution. All IRA owners required to take the MRD qualify for a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). All or any portion of your distribution donated to a qualifying charity is wholly tax free to you, which means you do not pay income tax on the QCD, which in turn lowers your adjusted gross income and your tax liability for the year. For tax filers that itemize deductions on Schedule A, you still claim the charitable deduction on your return. This is a perfect way for individuals to meet Campaign pledges and regular church pledges. I am here to help anytime on this or on stock donations to our campaign.
